Former President of Mexico, Vicente Fox, to Speak at the Charlotte Museum of History

Vicente Fox, former President of Mexico, will be the featured speaker for the 12th installment of the museum's Distinguished Speakers Series on Tuesday, January 26, 2010 at 8:00pm. The lecture will be followed by a wine and hors d'oeuvres reception.

Fox, President from 2000-2006, is a visionary leader with a deep understanding of the economic and social challenges facing Latin America. He became one of the world's most important voices on the contemporary geo-political landscape and the role of business in the developing world. During his tenure, Fox played a vital role in the democratization of Mexico, and is credited for the strengthening of the country's economy. He succeeded in controlling inflation and interest rates, and in achieving the lowest unemployment rate in all of Latin America.

The event will take place at the Charlotte Museum of History, with the lecture in the museum's Great Hall. Seating is limited, reservations are required, and is restricted to members of the museum.
